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***** Course Description:

The course discusses basic concepts in Physics and chemistry through laboratory work, the lab includes several experiments on the following topics (Motion; Forces and Newton's laws; Work and energy) and Chemistry (Gas Laws, Buoyancy and density, Viscosity, and the conservation of mass).

Course Objectives:

- 1. Develop a better understanding of basic physics and chemistry concepts.
- 2. Observe, analyze, and interpret data.
- 3. Learn to estimate different types of errors affecting the results.
- 4. Develop written reporting skills.
- 5. Use scientific apparatus in a wide range of experiments.
- 6. Practice collaborative problem-solving.
- Course Outcomes: After successfully completing the course, students should be able to
 - 1. Identify basic concepts of Physics and Chemistry.
 - 2. Analyze and solve physics and chemistry problems effectively.
 - 3. Develop written reporting skills.
